NIPAH VIRUS DISEASE (NiV Disease)



Symptoms

- Fever, headache, vomiting, fainting
- Some may show symptoms of epilepsy
- Symptoms may last for 10-12 days

Nipah scare in Indian subcontinent

2001: Siliguri (West Bengal, India) Affected – 66 Dead - 45

2011: Bangladesh Affected – 56 Dead - 50

Data: WHO

- Then, the infected may fall unconscious
- Incubation period: 6-21 days.
- Death may happen as brain fever develops at the final stage



How to prevent

How does it spread

- From fruit bats to animals through bites
- From animals to other animals through fluids
- From bats to humans (if one takes fruits bitten by bats)
- From animals to humans through body fluids
- From humans to humans through body fluids

Samples:

Do not eat fruits bitten by birds and animals Wash hands properly after contacting infected people Wear mask and gloves while tending to patients Do not drink toddy collected from areas where bats are found in large numbers

The samples may be as follows • Throat swab in viral transport medium • Urine 10 ml in universal sterile container • Blood in plain vial (atleast 5ml) • CSF (atleast 1 ml) in sterile container
